# Disability Services

- **15%** (165) reported a disability that affects their ability to perform as a student (e.g., a mobility, visual, hearing, or psychological impairment; learning disability; or ongoing health impairment).
- **47%** (77) of students who reported a disability, registered for disability support services at the University.
  - **58%** (44) of students who registered for disability support services, were either “satisfied” or “very satisfied” with the disability support they received ( $M=3.59$ ,  $N=76$ ).

- **29%** (48) of students who reported a disability had disability needs that were unmet.

# Overall Satisfaction

- **77%** (864) of students were either “satisfied” or “very satisfied” with their academic experience at Illinois ( $M=4.00$ ,  $N=1123$ ).
